The Global Alliance for Improved Nutrition (GAIN) is a Swiss-based foundation launched at the UN in 2002 to tackle the human suffering caused by malnutrition. In particular, we aim to make healthier food choices more desirable, more available, and more affordable. GAIN's mission is to advance nutrition outcomes by improving consumption of nutritious and safe food for all people, especially the most vulnerable to malnutrition.

DESCRIPTION

Overall purpose

Reporting to the SFS Senior Project Manager, the Business Development Associate, in close collaboration with the SME's team will conduct market diagnosis, identify constraints, design and facilitate development of the enterprise market systems that aim at enhancing the start-up and growth of enterprise using the Making Market Works for Poor (M4P) approach, supporting the delivery of GAIN's strategic plan for the SFS to be implemented in Cabo Delgado.

About the Sustainable Food System Project (SFS):

This project aims primarily to strengthen and repair the local food system in the southern segment of Cabo Delgado province, which has been severely impacted by conflict, drought, and long-standing under-investment. Ultimately, the project seeks to protect the consumption of the poorer residents of five vulnerable districts, including internally displaced persons from conflict areas and their hosts, with actions to improve both the availability and the affordability of safe and nutritious foods in their communities.

Tasks and responsibilities

Project Management

- Conduct assessment of enterprise markets system to identify constraints and opportunities for livelihoods improvement of women and youth in Cabo Delgado.
- Support with the development of tools and conduct a baseline assessment or landscape analysis at the beginning and through the stages of the project development and implementation to understand the business, distribution and market landscapes and to monitor, track and evaluate the project achievements systematically.
- Monitor and track the financial feasibility and sustainability of the business and recommend any improvements through the project implementation.
- Build the business model and technical capacity of selected grantees that improve the efficiency and effectiveness of their business
- Work with farmers and farmers groups to link them with the products and to processors.
- Identify new business opportunities and generate new sales leads and contacts for the business.
- Develop the interventions, result chains, indicators and document learning for each grantee enterprise
- Identify, assess and select the potential implementing partners for selected and emerging intervention

- Engage in market promotion and dissemination of relevant market information in supporting the targeted enterprises.
- Identify and collate the context specific information at national, meso and micro levels relevant for facilitating services or conditions for promoting the start-ups and growth of the enterprises.
